


CAA s. 112(i)(4)

(4) Presidential exemption

The President may exempt any stationary source from compliance with any standard or limitation under this section for a period of not more than 2 years if the President determines that the technology to implement such standard is not available and that it is in the national security interests of the United States to do so. An exemption under this paragraph may be extended for 1 or more additional periods, each period not to exceed 2 years. The President shall report to Congress with respect to each exemption (or extension thereof) made under this paragraph.

Memorandum of January 16, 2025

Orderly Implementation of the Air Toxics Standards for Ethylene Oxide Commercial Sterilizers

Memorandum for the Administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency and the Secretary of Health and Human Services

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, it is hereby ordered as follows: Section 1. Policy. The strengthened and updated Clean Air Act standards for ethylene oxide (EtO) emitted into the air from commercial sterilizing facilities issued by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) on April 5, 2024, National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants: Ethylene Oxide Emissions Standards for Sterilization Facilities Residual Risk and Technology Review, Final Rule. 89 FR 24,090 (Apr. 5, 2024) ("EtO Rule"), achieved a new milestone in my Administration's efforts to protect public health for all Americans and to advance the objective of my Administration's Cancer Moonshot initiative to prevent cancer before it starts. EtO has been associated with elevated cancer risks in communities around the United States and can be particularly harmful to children. The loss of loved ones from environmentally related cancer is a tragedy that the Nation can and must work together to end, once and for all.

The EtO Rule was issued after careful consideration of public comments and public hearings. In this rule, EPA set standards under section 112 of the Clean Air Act, as amended (the "Act") (42 U.S.C. 7401 et seq.), to control emissions from commercial sterilizers through the use of demonstrated and achievable pollution control technologies and practices. These standards will significantly reduce emissions of the toxic air pollutant EtO.

The EtO Rule applies to facilities that sterilize medical products, including medical devices and pharmaceuticals. Sterilization is critical to maintaining a safe supply of medical devices for patients and hospitals and providing health care to millions of Americans to help them stay healthy and fight diseases, including cancer. Consequently, EPA worked closely with the Department of Health and Human Services, including the Food and Drug Administration, to develop a final rule that protects communities exposed to pollution from sterilization facilities while also mitigating and managing the potential risk of any medical device supply disruptions.

EPA concluded that sterilization facilities will be able to install the appropriate technology to meet the standards of the EtO Rule before the compliance deadlines mandated by the Act. The EtO Rule also recognized that the President's authority under section 112(i)(4) of the Clean Air Act, 42 U.S.C. 7412(i)(4), to exempt individual facilities from compliance for a set period of time may provide an important mechanism to address the possibility that a facility may be unable to install all appropriate technology before the compliance deadline. 89 FR at 24,103. It is of vital national importance to ensure the reduction of EtO emissions to the level that EPA determined is required to protect public health pursuant to the Clean Air Act, while also avoiding the national security and public health effects that could result from a significant disruption to the medical device supply chain.

It is the policy of my Administration to safeguard the reliability of our Nation's supply of safe medical products. To advance orderly implementation of the EtO Rule, I am therefore establishing a process, provided below,

for considering requests for Presidential exemptions, the duration of which shall be as short as possible and no longer than two years. This process will ensure consideration of such requests in the exceptional circumstances in which a commercial sterilizer can demonstrate that, notwithstanding due diligence and best efforts, it will be unable to meet a covered standard or limitation required by the EtO Rule before the compliance deadline due to the unavailability of control technology for the facility, leading to likely shutdown of the facility, and the best available information demonstrates that the shutdown of the facility will likely lead to a serious disruption to the supply of medical products, such as medical devices and pharmaceuticals, necessary for America's national security and public health.

To achieve the EtO Rule's critical health protections as soon as practicable, while safeguarding the supply of safe medical products from disruption that would compromise the health and welfare of the American people, I direct you to take the following actions:

- **Sec. 2.** Implementation of a Process for Considering Presidential Exemptions. The Administrator of the EPA (Administrator) shall receive requests for a Presidential exemption from a standard or limitation in the EtO Rule under section 112(i)(4) of the Act (42 U.S.C. 7412(i)(4)), review them, and advise the President regarding whether to grant them through the following process:
- (a) Any commercial sterilizer seeking such an exemption shall submit a request to the Administrator no earlier than 12 months and no later than 4 months before the compliance deadline for which an exemption is sought. The request shall include:
 - (i) specific information of sufficient detail to enable verification of the reason or reasons that the technology to implement the applicable standard or limitation is unavailable for installation and that, notwithstanding its due diligence and best efforts, the facility cannot be brought into compliance before the compliance deadline for the covered standard or limitation (e.g., contracts, documentation of communication with vendors or suppliers);
 - (ii) a plan for procuring, installing, and operating the technology as soon as feasible in order to achieve compliance with the EtO Rule, and an assurance as described in subsection (h)(ii) of this section;
 - (iii) a list of all available practicable measures (i.e., technological and operational) that have already been taken or that are planned to advance compliance and additional measures, if any, that will be implemented to reduce the emissions of EtO and resulting risks during the exemption period:
 - (iv) a list of any alternative steps available, in progress, or already taken to try to avoid the need for additional time for compliance;
 - (v) the type or types of products sterilized at the facility, the volume of products sterilized at the facility, and the facility's annual sterilization capacity; and
 - (vi) the name, title, and signature of the responsible official who is certifying the accuracy of the request.
- (b) In reviewing an exemption request, and the information provided pursuant to this section, the Administrator, in consultation with the Secretary of Health and Human Services (Secretary), shall consider:
 - (i) whether the technology to implement a covered standard or limitation will be unavailable in time for installation and operation of the technology at a specific facility before the compliance deadline for such standard or limitation, due, for example, to shortages of labor, parts, control technology supply, supply-chain disruption, or other factors out of the facility's control;
 - (ii) the amount of time needed for installation and operation to occur in order to achieve compliance with the EtO Rule:

- (iii) the risk of a serious disruption to the supply of medical products (including pharmaceuticals and medical devices) should the facility be required to temporarily pause sterilization activities or reduce capacity until installation and operation can occur (including any potential alternatives to assure a sufficient supply of sterilization and sterilized medical products);
- (iv) the potential effect of any such disruption on public health and welfare, and any other information that may be relevant to an evaluation of whether granting an exemption is in the national security interests of the United States; and
- (vi) any other information that the Administrator, in consultation with the Secretary, deems relevant.
- (c) No later than 30 days after receiving a request pursuant to subsection (a) of this section, the Administrator shall confirm receipt of the request, notify the requester of any additional information needed to evaluate the request, set a deadline of no later than 15 days for the requester to provide the requested information, and provide public notification that the request was submitted (including the name of, the location of, and any other information regarding the facility requesting the exemption that the Administrator, in consultation with the Secretary, deems relevant and appropriate to publish).
- (d) As soon as practicable and no later than 30 days after receiving all necessary information to evaluate a request pursuant to this section, the Administrator, in consultation with the Secretary, shall provide the Chairman of the Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) with the request and accompanying information from the requester, any additional information that the Administrator deems relevant, and a recommendation regarding whether an exemption is warranted, including the basis for the recommendation, and if recommending that the President grant an exemption: the recommended duration, and any other accompanying terms or conditions (such as a schedule for status reports regarding planned steps and progress to achieve compliance with the EtO Rule).
- (e) As soon as practicable and generally within 45 days after receiving a recommendation from the Administrator pursuant to subsection (d) of this section, the Chairman of CEQ, in consultation with the Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs, the Assistant to the President for Economic Policy, the Assistant to the President for Domestic Policy, the Director of the Office of Pandemic Preparedness and Response Policy, and the Director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy, shall advise the President concerning the request for an exemption.
- (f) As expeditiously as practicable after the grant or denial of any exemption by the President under this process, and no later than 10 days after such a grant or denial, the Administrator shall notify the applicant.
- (g) Within 60 days of the grant of any exemption by the President under this process, the Administrator shall make publicly available online the name of, location of, and any other appropriate and relevant information regarding the facility receiving the exemption and the duration of any exemption, and shall submit to Congress the report required by section 112(i)(4) of the Act (42 U.S.C. 7412(i)(4)) on behalf of the President.
 - (h) The Administrator shall, as appropriate:
 - (i) provide technical assistance to any facility that receives an exemption to promote compliance with the EtO Rule:
 - (ii) seek information and assurance from any facility that requests an exemption that the facility will use its best efforts and will take reasonable and appropriate steps to demonstrate diligent action to install and operate necessary technology as expeditiously as practicable (including to fulfill any accompanying terms or conditions) to achieve compliance with the EtO Rule; and

- (iii) inform the Chairman of CEQ when installation of such technology is complete.
- Sec. 3. Federal Coordination. The Secretary, in consultation with the Administrator, shall consider taking additional steps, as appropriate, to further advance the goal of protecting the public from cancer and other harms from EtO exposure, including spurring innovation to reduce exposure to EtO and other carcinogenic air pollutants and to expand access to safe, effective, and reliable alternative methods for sterilization of medical equipment and pharmaceuticals that do not depend on EtO, and continuing to strengthen the resilience of our Nation's medical supply chain. Within 2 years of the date of this memorandum, the Secretary shall provide a report to the Chairman of CEQ regarding progress toward this directive and any steps taken or planned.
- **Sec. 4.** General Provisions. (a) Nothing in this memorandum shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect:
 - (i) the authority granted by law to an executive department or agency, or the head thereof; or
 - (ii) the functions of the Director of the Office of Management and Budget relating to budgetary, administrative, or legislative proposals.
- (b) This memorandum shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of appropriations.
- (c) This memorandum is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against the United States, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, employees, or agents, or any other person.
- (d) The Administrator is authorized and directed to publish this memorandum in the Federal Register.

Oxide NESHAP (40 CFR part 63, subpart O)

Dear Administrator Zeldin:

I am writing on behalf of a medical manufacturing device facility with an onsite sterilizer subject to the revised National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) for Commercial Sterilizers (40 CFR Part 63, Subpart O) published in the Federal Register on April 5, 2024. As described in more detail below, we respectfully petition the EPA to exercise its authority under the Clean Air Act to minimize the burden on manufacturing facilities covered by the rule and ensure the availability of sterilized medical devices necessary for patient care across the United States.

As you know, the revised Air Toxics Standards for Ethylene Oxide Commercial Sterilizers strengthened current standards and established new standards for previously unregulated emissions. Importantly, this rule requires the implementation of a permanent total enclosure (PTE) to capture all fugitive emissions, no matter how minimal, from handling sterilized material. As EPA acknowledged in its rulemaking, most facilities were not initially designed to implement PTE, which "will likely require redesign of a portion if not all" of these facilities to comply. Inevitably, many facilities will either need to cease or reduce operations to implement these upgrades.1 These challenges are exacerbated for manufacturing facilities whose operations include sterilization because they have been set up to optimize efficient product flow.2 While we fully support the goal of protecting public health and the environment, the current implementation timeline and lack of clarity around the exemption request process are causing a significant concern.

While certain requirements do not take effect until 2027, most existing facilities must comply by April 6, 2026, and demonstrate compliance one hundred and eighty days thereafter. Many impacted facilities, including those manufacturing medical devices, previously told EPA that this was insufficient time. Indeed, EPA's final rulemaking said that they "believe" facilities will be able to comply without "substantial" interruption if they commenced work immediately after the rule

became effective. For those working to implement this rule, it has become clear that EPA underestimated the potential disruption.

Knowing that the two-year implementation period may be insufficient, impacted facilities awaited further details referenced in the final rule regarding potential compliance exemptions. However, those details were not announced until January 2025 and only provided for a burdensome process that did not allow facilities to request an exemption until twelve months before their compliance deadline, which is likely too late. Although we are unaware of any official announcements regarding this memorandum, we assume it has either been rescinded or is no longer operative. To adequately plan their operations in the future, including whether onsite sterilization operations will need to cease or be relocated, clarification is required for applying for an exemption, the criteria for approval, and how long it will take to receive a decision.

Given the urgency, we respectfully ask the EPA to consider the following to ensure timely decisions to prevent any potential supply chain disruptions of sterilized medical products that could compromise patient care:

- 1. Guidance for Non-Routine Sterilized Material Handling: To reduce the burden on facilities covered by the rule whose primary purpose is to manufacture medical devices, issue interpretative guidance that handling of individual sterilized products outside the normal flow of material between sterilization and shipment for which representative area sampling is non-detect are presumed not to have fugitive emissions and therefore are not within the scope of the definition of Group 1 and Group 2 Air Emissions. This would eliminate the need to implement costly enclosures for areas of the facility, such as R&D or QA/QC, that do not handle sterilized materials in bulk and with no discernable reduction in emissions.
- 2. **Demonstration of Compliance**: Clarify that no facility will be held responsible for any aspect of the rule, even those for PTE, until after the 180-day relevant compliance period to demonstrate compliance under 40 CFR 63.7(a)(2).
- 3. Alignment of Compliance Deadlines: To avoid conflicting compliance deadlines, the EPA should interpret the revised NESHAP to allow facilities to comply with whichever applicable deadline is the longest. For instance, facilities using less than 10 tons per year of EtO should have an extra year to meet Group 2 and SCV requirements, aligning with the April 5, 2027, ARV, CEV, and Group 1 Air Emissions deadline.
- 4. Temporary Pause on Implementation: Issue a temporary pause on the implementation of the NESHAP (and commencement of the 180-day period to demonstrate compliance) until the exemption process is fully established and communicated to all affected facilities. EPA should also encourage delegated states to use their authority to extend compliance for one year to allow the EPA to develop a process for requesting and obtaining a compliance exemption under the Clean Air Act.
- 5. Establishment of a Streamlined Compliance Exemption Process: Provide detailed guidance as soon as possible for how facilities can apply for an exemption under the Clean Air Act, including the specific criteria for consideration and the timeline for decision-making. Given that the EPA already has voluminous information from most sterilization facilities through Section 114 Information Requests (and has toured many of them), EPA should be able to commit to notifying applicants of any exemption determinations within 30 days.
- Enforcement Discretion: Use EPA's enforcement discretion to toll the compliance period
 while any exemption application is pending and not include any such period in the 180day computation to demonstrate compliance. Any approvals should be retroactive to the

beginning of the compliance period, and enforcement discretion should be used for any facilities that may have applied for an exemption and were denied.

7. Special Consideration for Low-Risk Operations: In issuing guidance and implementing the process for obtaining exemptions, EPA should give special consideration to facilities with low or minimal EtO emissions, including those that use less than 10 TPY and have de minimis fugitive emissions.

These steps are necessary to balance reducing EtO emissions with maintaining the availability of life-saving medical devices. We look forward to your prompt attention and request a meeting at your earliest convenience to discuss a workable path forward.³

Announcing Streamlined Process for the Regulated Community to request a Presidential Exemption under Section 112(i)(4) of the Clean Air Act

Desk Statement

To advance President Trump's Executive Orders and Power the Great American Comeback, EPA has set up an electronic mailbox to allow the regulated community subject to nine Clean Air Act rules listed below, known as National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants, to request a Presidential Exemption under section 112(i)(4) of the Clean Air Act. A request for a Presidential Exemption may be submitted through [HYPERLINK "mailto:airaction@epa.gov" \h].

The Clean Air Act allows the President to exempt stationary sources of air pollution from compliance with any standard or limitation under section 112 for up to two years if the technology to implement the standard is not available and it is in the national security interests of the United States to do so.

An exemption may be extended for up to two additional years and can be renewed, if appropriate.

<u>Background</u>

On March 12, 2025, EPA requested that facilities and/or affected sources subject to the regulations below to submit information about why their facility and/or affected source meets the requirements under Clean Air Act Section 112(i)(4) for a Presidential exemption while EPA reconsiders these rules:

Consistent with EPA's request dated March 24, 2025, encouraging the regulated community to request a Presidential Exemption for compliance under section 112(i)(4) of the Clean Air Act (CAA) by March 31, 2025, Becton Dickinson and Company (BD) is requesting that the President issue a two-year exemption pursuant to his authority under CAA Section 112(i)(4) for all emission standards, monitoring requirements and any other applicable requirements in EPA's April 4, 2024 National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants: Ethylene Oxide Emissions Standards for Sterilization Facilities Residual Risk and Technology Review, 89 FR 24090 (April 5, 2024) (Sterilizer Rule). BD requests this two-year compliance exemption for the following facilities which are regulated by the Sterilizer Rule and all sources therein:

Beeton Dickinson and Company BD Covington 8195 Industrial Boulevard Covington, Georgia

Beeton Dickinson and Company BD Madison 1211 Mary Magnan Boulevard Madison, Georgia

Becton Dickinson and Company BD Medical 9450 South State Street Sandy, Utah

Becton Dickinson and Company BD Medical Pharmaceutical Systems 920 East 19th Street Columbus, Nebraska

Becton Dickinson and Company Edwards Lifesciences Technology Sàrl Parque Industrial Carr. PR-402, Km. 1.4 N Anasco, Puerto Rico

BD requests that the President issue a <u>two-year exemption</u> for compliance related to the new Sterilizer Rule. Specifically:

- For standards set or revised under CAA Section 112(f) and all corresponding requirements (including monitoring requirements), the exemption should apply as of April 6, 2026 (the compliance deadline for those standards);
- For standards set or revised under CAA Section 112(d) and all corresponding requirements (including monitoring requirements), the exemption should apply as of April 5, 2027 (the compliance deadlines for those standards).

An extension is requested to ensure that the technology used to comply with the standard is available, capable, and reliable:

Despite our best efforts, BD may not meet the April 6, 2026 compliance deadline. Although we started planning and design activities well in advance of the issuance of the new rule, the time necessary to execute very complex plant upgrades will likely exceed the compliance deadline(s). These upgrades require a methodical approach to engineering, procurement, and construction, including but not limited to; project planning, supplier qualification, facility and equipment design, procurement, permitting and approval by State and local authorities, construction of facilities, equipment installation, commissioning and validation, as well as training. Many of the systems and equipment necessary to meet the new rule are not off-the-shelf solutions. Each facility is unique, requiring highly customized solutions and will require careful integration and testing to ensure full compliance with various regulations and to avoid compromised safety of the operation, reliability of the plant and equipment, and to avoid disruption of supply.

It is questionable whether even the best control technologies can meet the requirements of the new rule under all operating <u>conditions</u>. For example, it is questionable whether or not certain emissions control devices can meet minimum DRE requirements under low inlet conditions such as would be expected during periods of low production, reduced operating capacity, plant shutdown/startup, and other atypical operating scenarios. It is also questionable whether current technology for the control of Group 1 and Group 2 emissions can meet the minimum DRE requirements under all operating conditions. Product type and volume sterilized at each facility vary widely and may be subject to swings in market demand among other external factors.

Additionally, the lead time of various materials and equipment required for the plant upgrades is variable. For example, the lead time of emissions control equipment is approximately 12-18 months and there is only a limited number of vendors who can supply this equipment, and the lead time for high voltage transformers and electrical switch gear are currently 12 months or greater. In some cases additional utility requirements necessitate the involvement of the public utility company to increase local or regional capacity which may add additional complexity and time to project schedules. Furthermore, BD anticipates additional financial burden and import/customs clearance complexity with the import of custom emissions control equipment specific to the Covington, Georgia and Madison, Georgia facility which add additional financial burden and lead time for delivery of such equipment due to current and pending tariffs.

An extension is in the national security interests of the United States for the following reasons:

BD supplies billions of sterile medical devices that enable healthcare providers to safely provide a variety of life saving therapies to patients in the US and around the world. Additionally, BD is a key supplier to the US Government.

Medical devices must be sterilized to prevent the spread of bacteria, viruses, and other pathogens, like methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus ("MRSA"), HIV, and hepatitis B, that can lead to deadly infections. While BD sites deploy a variety of sterilization methods, approximately 50% of BD products currently can only be sterilized with EtO, including IV catheters, PICC catheters, surgical prep devices, surgical kits, Foley urinary catheter trays, glass syringes, chemotherapy ports, among many others. A more detailed summary of several of these products are outlined below.

BD produces sterile vascular access devices that allow healthcare providers to safely give medications, hydration and nutritional fluid therapies, and blood products to patients used both in the hospital as well as in outpatient areas of healthcare. Up to 90 % of hospitalized patients require IV therapy, and over 95% of the devices used are peripheral IV

catheters ("PIVC"). This corresponds to over 1 billion peripheral IV insertions being performed worldwide, annually. BD supplies a significant portion of IV catheters to the US market.

BD produces drug delivery devices that improve a patient's quality of life, including ready-to-fill syringes that are used to deliver drugs and vaccines indicated to prevent invasive diseases, reduce the risks of life changing conditions like heart attacks and strokes, as well as treat chronic conditions such as Crohn's disease, arthritis and diabetes. A large majority of the injectable biotech drugs delivered subcutaneously or intramuscularly are delivered in BD's sterile Prefillable Syringes. Many of the top bio-pharma companies rely heavily on BD for these products.

BD also produces devices used to diagnose and treat patients with cancer (especially breast, liver and blood cancers), end-stage-renal disease, peripheral arterial disease, complex abdominal hernia and reconstruction, and hemostasis to prevent bleeding during advanced surgical procedures. Our products are used in the majority of patients undergoing surgery in these areas and those in intensive care/post-operative care units.

BD utilizes EtO sterilization because it is the only method of sterilization that can be used for these products. As EPA explains, "Commercial sterilization facilities play a vital role in maintaining an adequate supply of medical devices. According to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA), 'Literature shows that about fifty percent of all sterile medical devices in the U.S. are sterilized with ethylene oxide.'" 88 Fed. Reg. 22,793.

As voiced directly to EPA during the public comment period BD believes that the technical complexity of the new rules and the aggressive compliance deadline threaten supply continuity for critical medical products. BD respectfully requests extension to the compliance deadline to ensure upgrades are designed, constructed, and commissioned in accordance with all applicable regulatory requirements and industry standards while maintaining safe operations and avoiding unnecessary supply disruptions that would threaten or diminish the standard of care for patients.

BD appreciates EPA's attention to this important matter and request the exemption be granted as quickly as possible.
